Merlot is the second most widely planted red wine grape in the world
(Cabernet Sauvignon is #1)

The Merlot grape is originally from France's Bordeaux region,
where it is one of the five main red varieties that make up the
"Chateau" wines there.

"Merlot" roughly translates to "little blackbird" in old French
– perhaps so named because this early ripening grape was a favorite
of the birds at harvest time.
