Cabernet Sauvignon is the most widely planted wine grape in the world.

The Cabernet Sauvignon grape is originally from France's Bordeaux region, where it is one of the five main red varieties that make up the "Chateau" wines there.

When researching potential Cabernet growing sites in the 1980s, Jerry Lohr and his team recognized that the dramatic low-to-high temperature swings in Paso Robles (often spanning 45 to 50°F in a single day) would create optimal flavor development in Cabernet grapes.

In J. Lohr's original Cabernet vineyards in Paso Robles, there is a stand of magnificent oak trees that still thrive today.



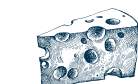
